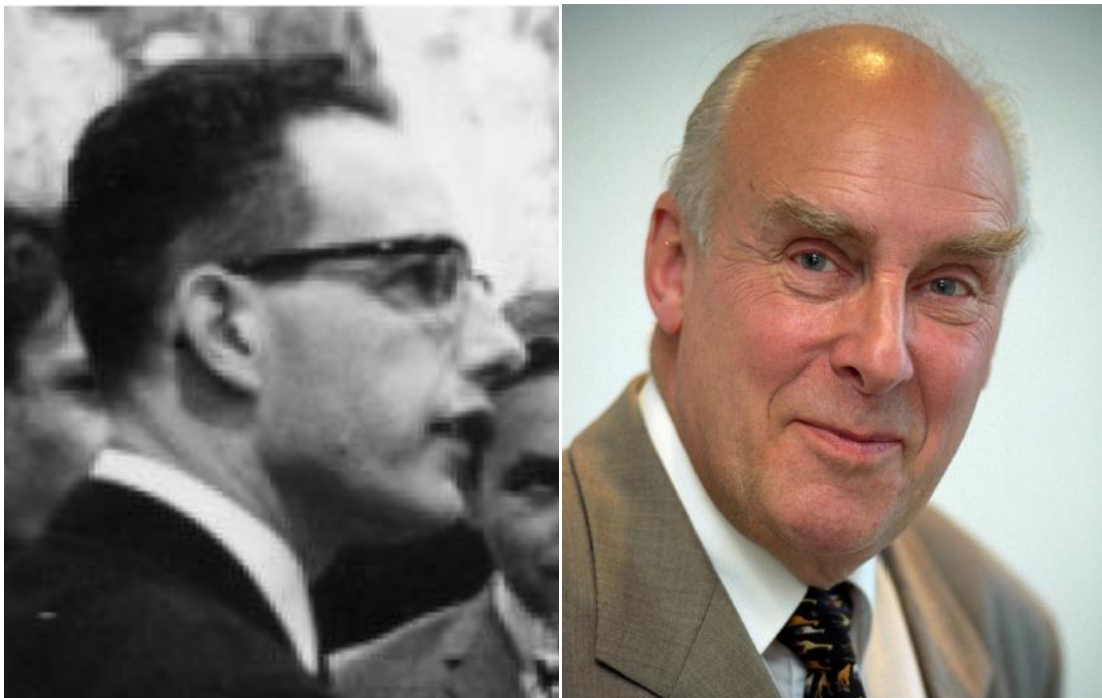

Plans are well underway for 18ICM at the Hungarian Museum of Natural History in Budapest from 25-31 August 2019. A highlight of the past year is the publication of the proceedings volume from 17ICM in Krabi, Thailand, as *ZooKeys* 741. We thank our colleagues at Pensoft for assisting with the efficient production of the volume, and to authors and referees for their contributions.

2018 has been marked by tragedy for our community. The devastating fire at the Museu Nacional Rio de Janeiro in September resulted in the loss of irreplaceable specimens, many of which were central to the research activities of our colleagues in Brazil. The myriapod community is united in expressing solidarity with our Brazilian friends affected by the fire.

Since our last Newsletter towards the end of 2017, two of the founders of the CIM, Jean-Marie Demange and Otto Kraus, passed away. Both made vast contributions to our field, in their scientific work and in initiating the CIM.

CIM Council will have quite a high turnover at 18ICM, as eight Councillors elected in 2011 will not be eligible for re-election. Members who are interested in playing a role in the life of the CIM will hopefully make themselves available for the vacant roles on Council.

I thank our Secretary Stelios Simaiakis, for steering this edition of the Newsletter towards production, and to CIM Council for advice through the year.

I look forward to seeing you all in Budapest in August.

The new website of the Centre International de Myriapodologie (<http://www.myriapodology.org/>) went online on 8 May 2014. It featured a new look and design, and a lot of content was updated in order to inform a broad audience about the International Society of Myriapodology. The website contains the CIM statutes, current composition of the CIM Council and Board, all CIM Bulletin covers are online, the CIM Newsletter is available for download, past and future International Congresses of Myriapodology are presented and advertised, as well as a list of all CIM members, obituaries, a search engine for the Myriapoda literature database reference database MyriaLit, and links to important Myriapoda databases and journals.

Statistics

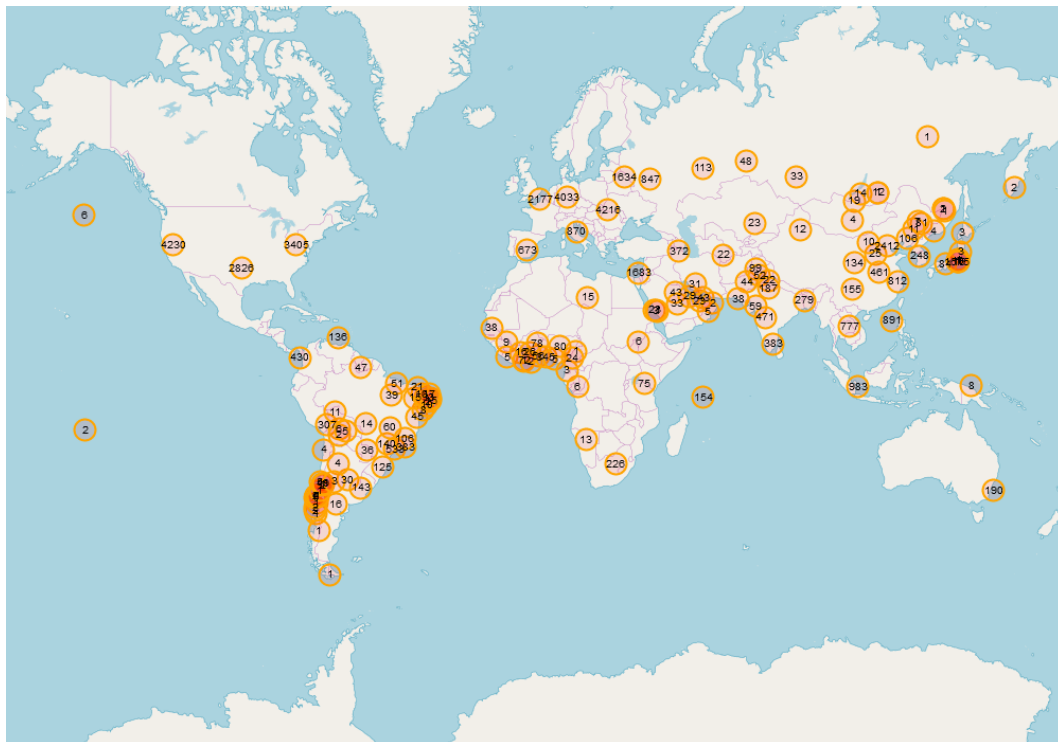


Figure 1. Map of unique IP addresses and counts of access on the CIM website.

A total of 42,321 unique accesses by different IP addresses were counted during the last year (1 October 2017 – 1 October 2018). The majority of users came from Asia (ca. 15,000 accesses), Europe (ca. 13,000) and North America (ca. 10,000), but also from Central and South America (ca. 2,800), Africa (ca. 1,100) and Australia (190). The map (Figure 1) clearly shows that the CIM website has a worldwide outreach and people from all continents are interested in Myriapoda.

Jean-Marie Demange 1922-2017 - an obituary

Jean-Marie Demange was born on August 2nd, 1922 in the city of Epinal, in the French Vosges. He passed away on Sunday October 22, 2017 in the city of Niort, Charente-Maritime. He was 95 years old.

He had a son, two granddaughters and one great-grandson.

Among several activities, Jean-Marie Demange became a specialist on historical antique oil lamps, old time-keeping devices and ancient clocks with

very complicated mechanisms.

But above all, he made himself a specialist on a particular group of arthropods, the myriapods, and more precisely the predatory centipedes and the saprophagous millipedes.

Jean-Marie Demange devoted his scientific career of zoologist to centipede and millipede biology, in the laboratory 'Zoologie-Vers et Crustacés', then laboratory 'Zoologie-

Arthropodes' of the *Muséum National d'Histoire Naturelle* of Paris (MNHN), under the successive directorships of Professor Louis Fage, then Professor Max Vachon and finally Professor Yves Coineau. He was also very active in scientific societies, particularly the 'Société Zoologique de France'.

In 1967 he defended a thesis entitled *Recherches sur la segmentation du tronc des chilopodes et des diploptides chilognathes (Myriapodes)*, published in the 'Mémoires du Muséum National d'Histoire Naturelle'.

He published many taxonomic descriptions and biological results in papers, monographs and books, related to different aspects of myriapod anatomy, development, locomotion, and venoms. This last particular point was initiated and developed in the pedagogic course of lectures given at the MNHN, still going on to this day.

In collaboration with our friend Jean-Paul Mauriès (MNHN, Paris) and Professor Otto Kraus (University of Hamburg, Germany), Jean-Marie Demange was the founding member of the Centre International de Myriapodologie (the CIM), created in 1968 in Paris (France), a scientific society that is today the CIM - International Society for Myriapodology, that increases internationally and contributes to regularly organize international congresses of myriapodology.

He was the CIM Treasurer for some years and deeply involved in myriapod bibliography.

I met him personally for the first time in 1974 - when I was a student in population ecology and systematics in Professor Maxime Lamotte's laboratory. I began to learn how to walk with myriapods, and I never regreted this choice.

The making, writing, printing and mailing of the yearly CIM Questionnaire and CIM Bulletin, gave us opportunities to work together with Jean-Paul Mauriès and Monique Nguyen, fighting against reluctant stencils and roneo machines, looking for bibliographic references, sticking stamps on envelopes to be sent all over the world to colleagues. This image of the past is not melancholy, times are changing, evolving and improving. We can keep in memory moving moments of friendship.

Brazil's oldest and most important historical and scientific museum has been consumed by fire, and much of its archive of 20 million items is believed to have been destroyed.

The fire at Rio de Janeiro's 200-year-old National Museum began after it closed to the public on Sunday and raged into the night. There were no reports of injuries, but the loss to Brazilian science, history and culture was

SCHUBARTIANA is an open access journal with no charges for submission, article processing or open access. Articles are published online as PDF prior to a printed issue once per year. There is no limit to page numbers and supplementary files can be provided. Copyright on any article is retained by the author(s) and full texts can be distributed, printed or linked.
